Boston University Summer Term. Two opportunities are being offered:

High School Honors is a six-week residential or commuting program in which students can either take two Boston University undergraduate courses, earning up to eight credits, or conduct scientific research under the guidance of a faculty mentor. Participants must be entering their senior year in fall 2008.

Summer Challenge is a two week residential program for students entering their sophomore, junior, or senior year in fall 2008. Summer Challenge students enroll in two non-credit seminars designed specifically for the program. Seminar topics this year include abnormal psychology, business, creative writing, ecology, the history of Boston, international politics, introduction to Chinese, journalism, law, mass communication, persuasive writing and visual arts.
